

UCAYALI'S COMMITMENT TO ACCESS TO JUSTICE FOR PEOPLE IN VULNERABLE CONDITIONS

In the city of Pucallpa, on December 5, 6 and 7, 2019, it was held the “VI International Meeting of the Judicial Powers of Peru and Ibero-America America” and the “VIII National Meeting of the Presidents of the Superior Courts of Justice and District Responsible Officers for Access to Justice for People in Conditions of Vulnerability and Justice in your Community”.

We endorse the institutional commitment of the Judicial Power of Peru to protect the fundamental rights of vulnerable groups, the Permanent Commission of Access to Justice of People in a Condition of Vulnerability and Justice in your Community, the Presidents of the Superior Courts of Justice and the District Responsible Officers of Access to Justice of the Courts of the country, in coordination with other Government and civil society entities, in accordance with the objectives for sustainable development of the United Nations 2030 Agenda, we hereby declare as follows:

FIRST.- Promote the application of the Protocol of Justice of School Peace to prevent and punish violence in educational institutions throughout the country.

SECOND.- Prepare a document that allows inter-institutional articulation to promote peaceful coexistence in schools.

THIRD.- Apply the Protocol of Single Interview in Gesell Chamber for girls, boys and adolescents, in order to avoid their revictimization.

FOURTH.- Develop a document establishing the guidelines for the Family Meeting Room and its installation in the Superior Courts of Justice of the country.

FIFTH.- Strengthen the Itinerant Justice service to bring the judicial system closer to places concentrating people in vulnerable conditions.

SIXTH.- Prepare a document guaranteeing speed in the execution of alimony sentences in favor of girls, boys and adolescents.

SEVENTH.- Promote the application of Restorative Justice for adolescents in conflict with criminal law, through juvenile criminal mediation.

EIGHTH.- Promote inter-institutional coordination efforts to Implement non-addictive drug and/or alcohol treatment to reinforce the socio-educational measure for adolescents in conflict with criminal law.

NINTH.- Guarantee access to justice for persons with disabilities, applying the provisions of Legislative Decree No. 1384 and its respective regulations, as well as the Protocol of Judicial Assistance for Persons with Disabilities.

TENTH.- Develop a document regulating the operation of a computer application for mobile devices for the promotion of rights in favor of people with disabilities.

ELEVENTH.- Ensure access to judicial services for all people without any type of discrimination based on their gender, sexual orientation or gender identity.

TWELFTH.- Prepare a document establishing the standards of judicial care in favor of persons who are victims of violence or discrimination based on gender.

THIRTEENTH.- Recognize the work of the Judicial Counselors who are community leaders who voluntarily and free of charge contribute to improving access to justice and care for vulnerable people and groups, especially at police stations, prosecutors' offices and courts.

FOURTEENTH.- Establish a national, inter-institutional and interdisciplinary network, to prevent and address any form of violence and discrimination against people in vulnerable conditions, called "Network of Access to Justice".

FIFTEENTH.- Agree on the next venue of the "VII International Meeting of the Judicial Powers of Peru and Latin America" and the "IX National Meeting of the Presidents of the Superior Courts of Justice and District Responsible Officers for Access to Justice for People in a Condition of Vulnerability and Justice in your Community".

SIXTEENTH.- Constitute the Peruvian Chapter of the Pan American Committee of Judges for Social Rights and the Franciscan Doctrine to strengthen the justice system.

SEVENTEENTH.- Ratify the commitment of the Permanent Commission of Access to Justice of Persons in a Condition of Vulnerability and Justice in your Community of the Judicial Power of Peru and of the 34 Superior Courts of Justice of the country to execute the “ National Plan for Access to Justice for People in a Condition of Vulnerability 2016-2021”.
